Length of Course: 1 year

B. Course Description

English 3, 4 is a year-long, required course that is taken during the sophomore year. It is a continuation of English 1, 2. The course focuses on literature, writing and communication. Composition instruction stresses summarization, literary analysis, expository and research-based writing. In literature students study the Shakespearean drama Hamlet, as well as selected short stories, essays, and the novel Of Mice and Men. The communication component of the course offers the student the opportunity to learn about communication in all forms. The student will learn how to be a better conversationalist, as well as a better public speaker. The class also covers listening skills, perception, nonverbal communication, and interpersonal communication. Students will be required to give three major speeches.
